What is Iowa's London Law Program?



- 2-week study abroad program in the UK (London and Oxford)
- Sunday, December 27, 2026, through Saturday, January 9, 2027
- Open to all students from ABA-Accredited Law Schools: last year 4 students from other schools participated
- Largest study abroad program run by a US Law School: last year 76 students/12 guests participated

What's the price and what's included?

- \$4,750 Program Fee (*may be subject to small increase this year*)
- Nonrefundable deposit of \$250 due at time of registration
- 2 LAW credits (courses off law school mandatory curve)
- Field Trips
- Group Meals and other activities
- Housing
- **Limited number of scholarships available to offset Program costs**

What are the housing options?



In London:

- Shared rooms/apartments in FSU London Study Centre apartment complex
- Single room in hotel (*extra fee charged*)
- Twin (for friends sharing) or double (for couples) room in hotel
- Queen-size room in hotel (*extra fee charged*)

In Oxford:

- Individual room (with study space and bathroom)
- Double room (with study space and bathroom)

Can I bring a guest?

- Enrolled students can bring a partner/sibling/friend
- Guest fee of \$2,500 (*may be subject to small increase this year*)
- Fee includes: Housing, group meals, and social activities
- Fee DOES NOT INCLUDE: academic field trips
